FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome Kia Ora, Welcome to our school. We hope you find some interesting and useful information about us in this prospectus and on our website. You can also follow us on Facebook, for more photos and daily information. We welcome visits and will answer any questions you may have. Our teachers and students enjoy being part of this exciting, vibrant, rural school. We provide a quality education which will prepare you for your future.

Tauraroa Area School focuses on challenging and supporting students to live up to our school vision of being the best you can be. Our positive approach continues to produce outstanding results in academic, leadership, sporting and cultural areas. Our students learn in an environment of mutual respect, with an emphasis on sound learning and teaching practice. You will enjoy a range of facilities, including a heated swimming pool, synthetic turf courts, full-sized rugby and football fields, outstanding gymnasium, extensive computer equipment, and well-resourced classrooms. Our school is undergoing a multi-million rebuild at present with the new gymnasium, Science rooms and bathrooms completed. The general-purpose classrooms for the Intermediate and High School areas will be the next part to be completed along with a new all-sports turf.

Tauraroa Area School (TAS) is situated in a picturesque rural location, 22km SW of Whangarei, via SH1 and Maungakaramea or Mangapai roads. We are four kilometers from the village of Maungakaramea, an area experiencing strong population growth. It is an ideal learning environment, and it is no surprise that our school is enjoying a growing reputation in the Whangarei region and beyond.

With a roll of 500+ students and catering for Years 1 -13 students, the school is large enough to have the advantages of a range of specialist teachers and facilities, yet small enough to retain the flexibility and pastoral support individual students need.

International students hold a special place in the school, enjoying the friendliness of local students and the school community. Our international students have the chance to experience 'the real New Zealand'. The junior, intermediate, and high school students enjoy shared activities, such as assemblies, sports, and activity days.

The Board of Trustees and senior management of the school are committed to fostering high expectations of student achievement and behaviour, student leadership opportunities, a strong outdoor education programme, a close and positive relationship with parents and friends of the school.

You might like to also try debating. You will develop some great skills which you can take with you in further study. It is also a lot of fun and you don't need any prior debating experience.




ACADEMIC

We offer a full range of subjects, both academic and practical. If there is a subject you would like to add, and not a class available, we offer online learning in that subject area with online tutorials. Our helpful staff will ensure a varied and interesting programme is available for you.

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This means we can offer a variety of subjects and give you a varied programme. If there is a subject we can't offer, we can provide online learning with tutorials each week. This allows us to provide an individualized programme for you. These cover a range of subjects including History, Philosophy, Psychology and Languages.




ACADEMIC PROGRAMME: OVERVIEW

YEAR 0 - 8	A warm, supportive programme based on the latest scientific research for the best results. Through engagement in the eight learning areas of the New Zealand Curriculum, our students encounter the essential principles, values and key competencies to support success in their senior schooling years and life beyond the classroom. The core programme is provided by homeroom teachers with specialist teaching in areas such as Physical Education, Technology, Te Reo and the Arts.
YEAR 9 - 10	English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Health and Physical Education are compulsory for the whole year. Modules are offered in a range of other subject options such as Digital Technology, Drama, Music, Health, Food Technology, Visual Art and Te Reo.
YEAR 11	Six subjects are required for Level 1 NCEA. English, Mathematics and Science are compulsory with a further three subjects chosen from Building & Construction, Drama, Design & Visual Communication, Digital Technology, Geography, Health, Hospitality, Music, Physical Education, Sustainable Rural Development, Te Reo, and Visual Art.
YEAR 12	Six subjects are recommended. Subjects offered: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Digital Technology, Digital and Visual Communication, English, Geography, Gateway/Trades, Music, Sustainable Rural Development, Te Reo, Tourism, Visual Art, and Young Enterprise Studies (Business Studies). Other subjects are also available online, such as History, Languages, Psychology and Philosophy.
YEAR 13	Year 13 subjects available include Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Digital Technology, Digital and Visual Communication, English, Music, Physics, Physical Education. Sustainable Rural Development (off campus) Te Reo, Tourism, Visual Art and Young Enterprise Studies (Business Studies). Other subjects are also


available online, such as History, Psychology and Philosophy.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES
